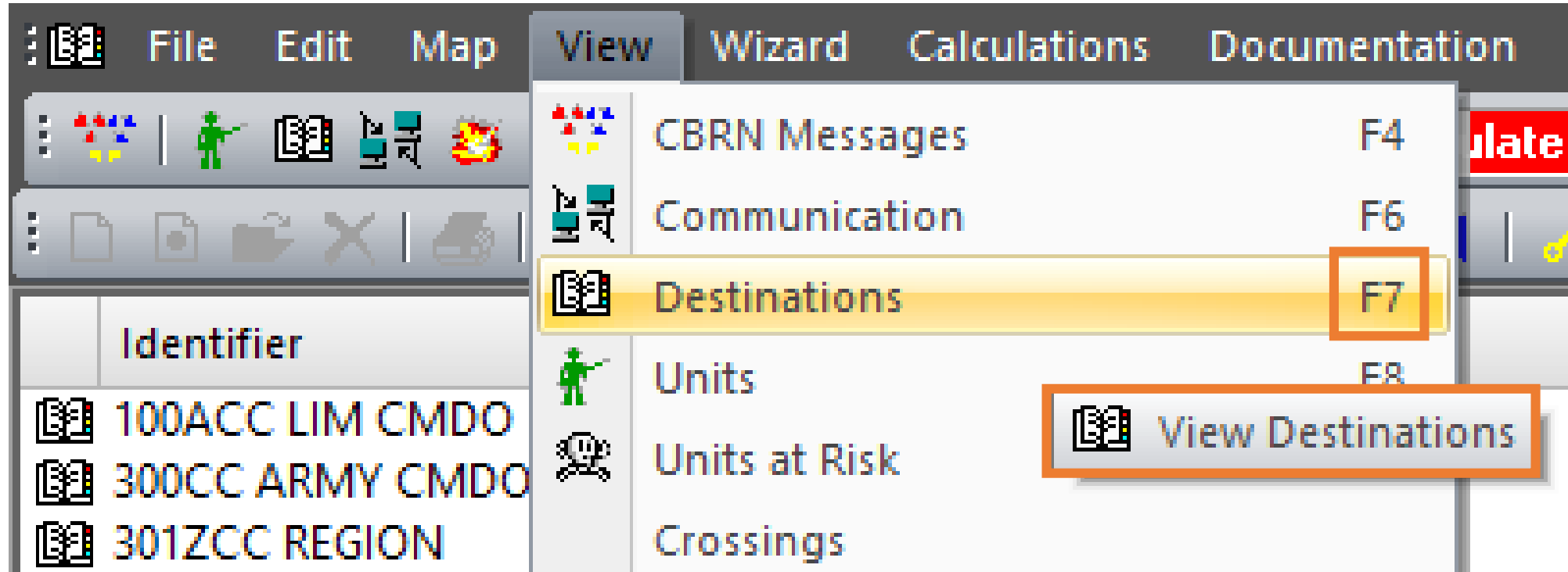


# How to Create Destinations

Menu: View/Destinations or F7  
- will open the Destination View



# How to Create Destinations

Destinations (addresses) must be created before you can transmit reports (click on Create Icon)

# How to Create Destinations

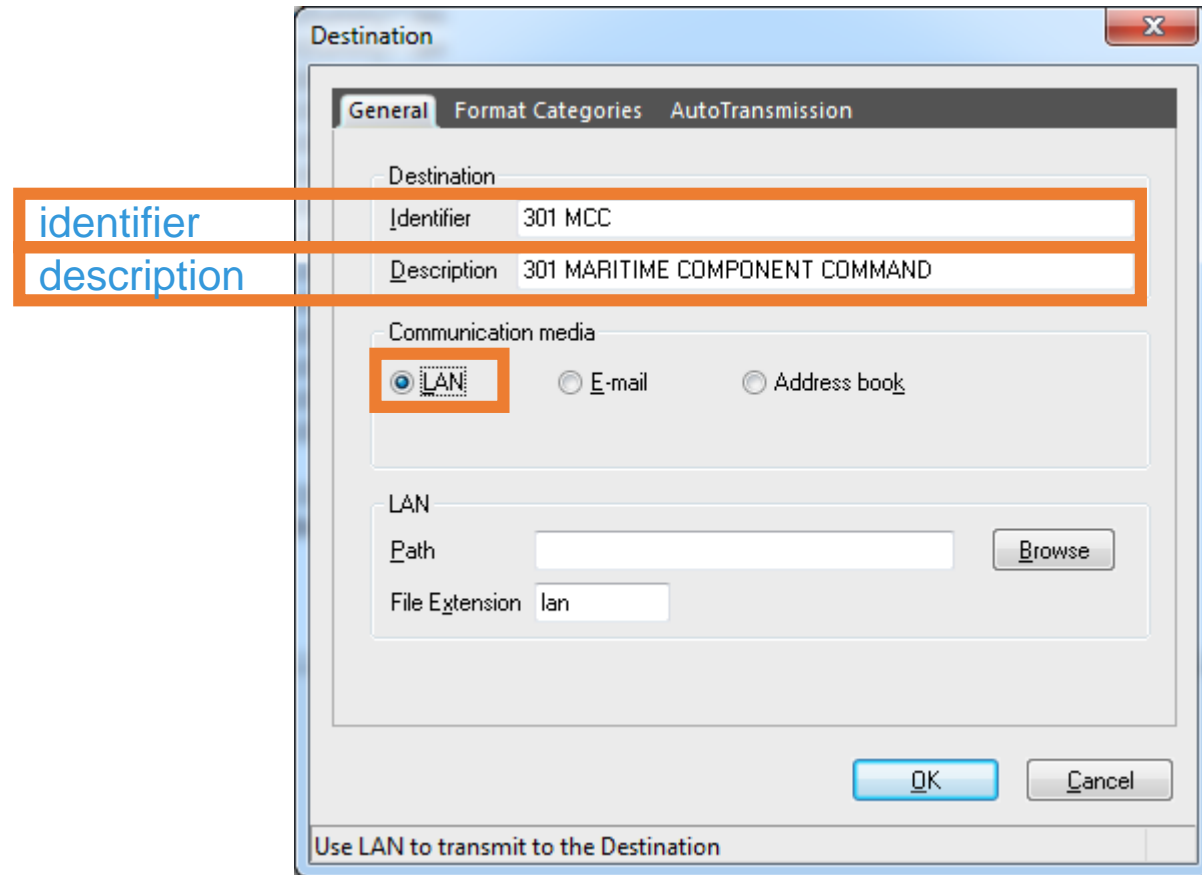
## Identifier, Description and Media

The Destination

# How to Create Destinations

## Destination type LAN

Browse e.g. to the 301 MCC folder on the common folder on the server where the mailbox for 301 MCC using LAN media is located

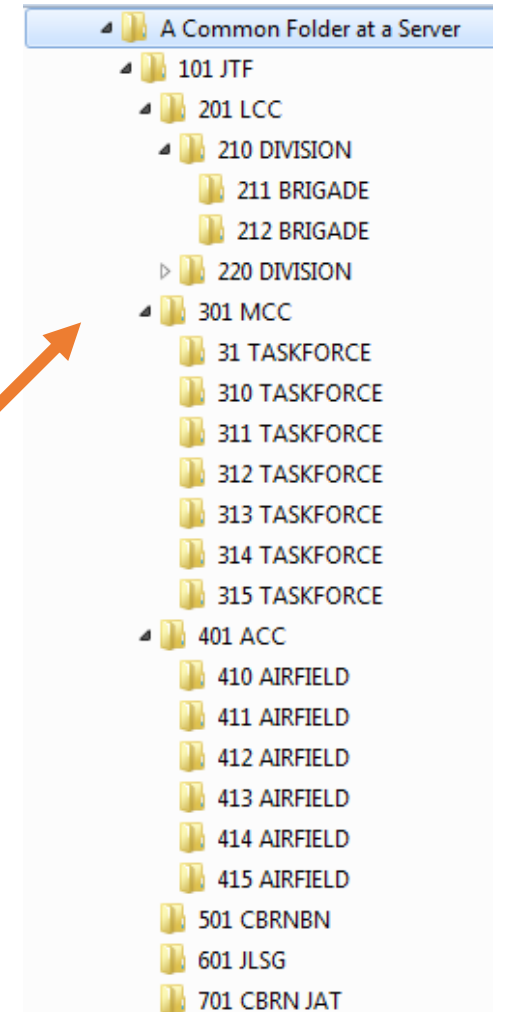




# How to Create Destinations

## Destination type LAN

Select the File extension (LAN file name) the 301 MCC is using e.g. LAN

Other file (extension) names are allowed

# How to Create Destinations

## Destination type LAN

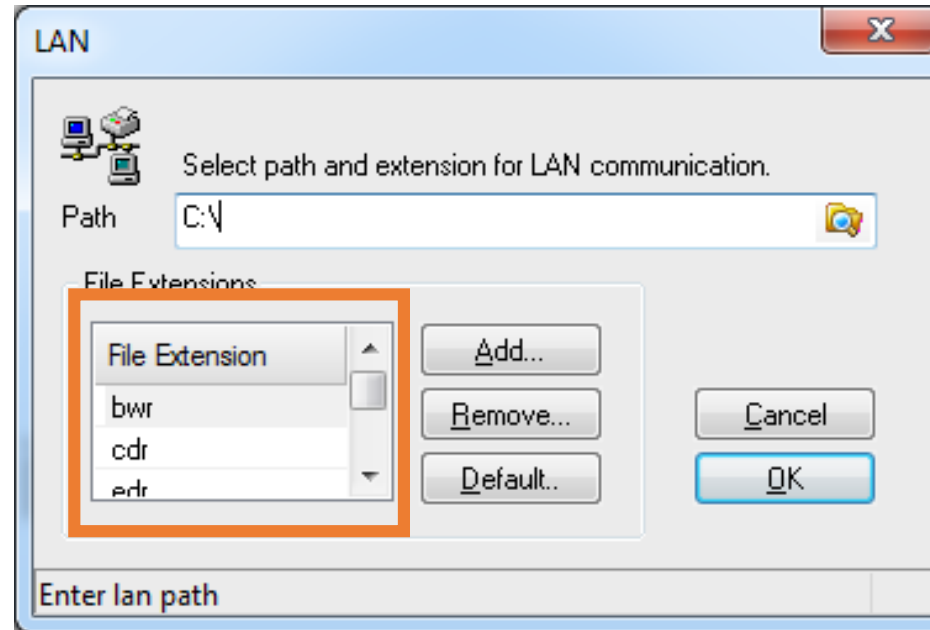
Your own File extension (file name) was selected when you created your mailbox

**bwr**, **cdr** and **edr** =

prepared for future MET reports formats

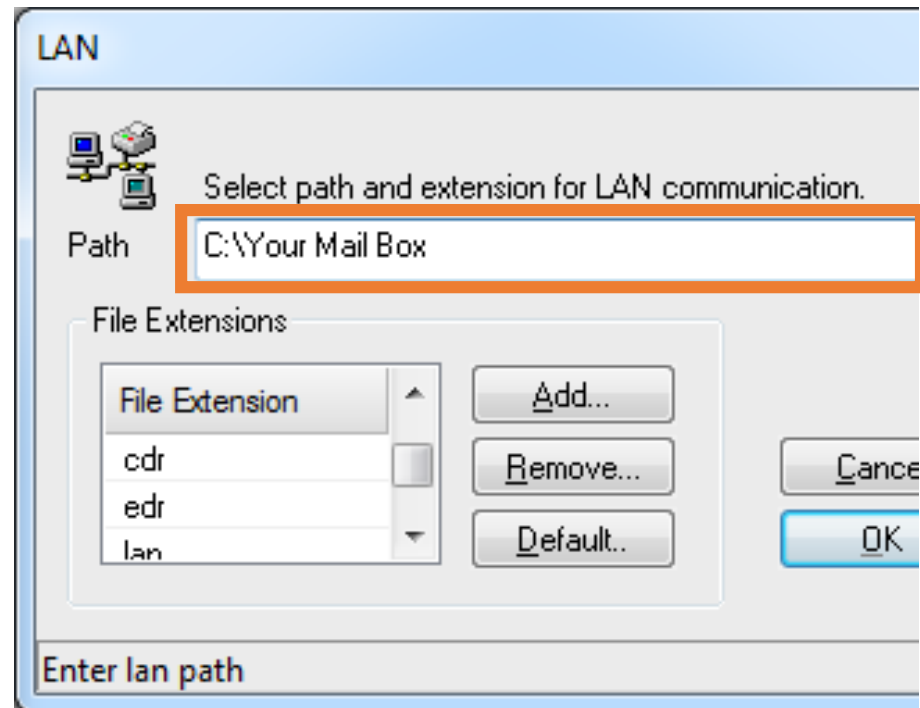


# How to Create Destinations

## LAN Extensions

Normally “lan” is used as standard but also because this is required for e.g. CAX exercises

The program will accept all the entered extension names, but default values are set to: “lan”, “bwr”, “edr” and “cdr “ because these may be used as NATO MET standards





# How to Create Destinations


## Destination type E-mail

Identifier and Media must be unique.

If more than one media is used,  
another Destination must be created.

Select Media: E-mail

Enter: e-mail address

# How to Create Destinations

Computers with e-mail must have an e-mail account on the computer e.g. Outlook or Exchange

E-mail in the cloud e.g. Hotmail cannot be used




# How to Create Destinations

## Use of Address Book

Select: Address Book

Click on: Lookup to open your address book

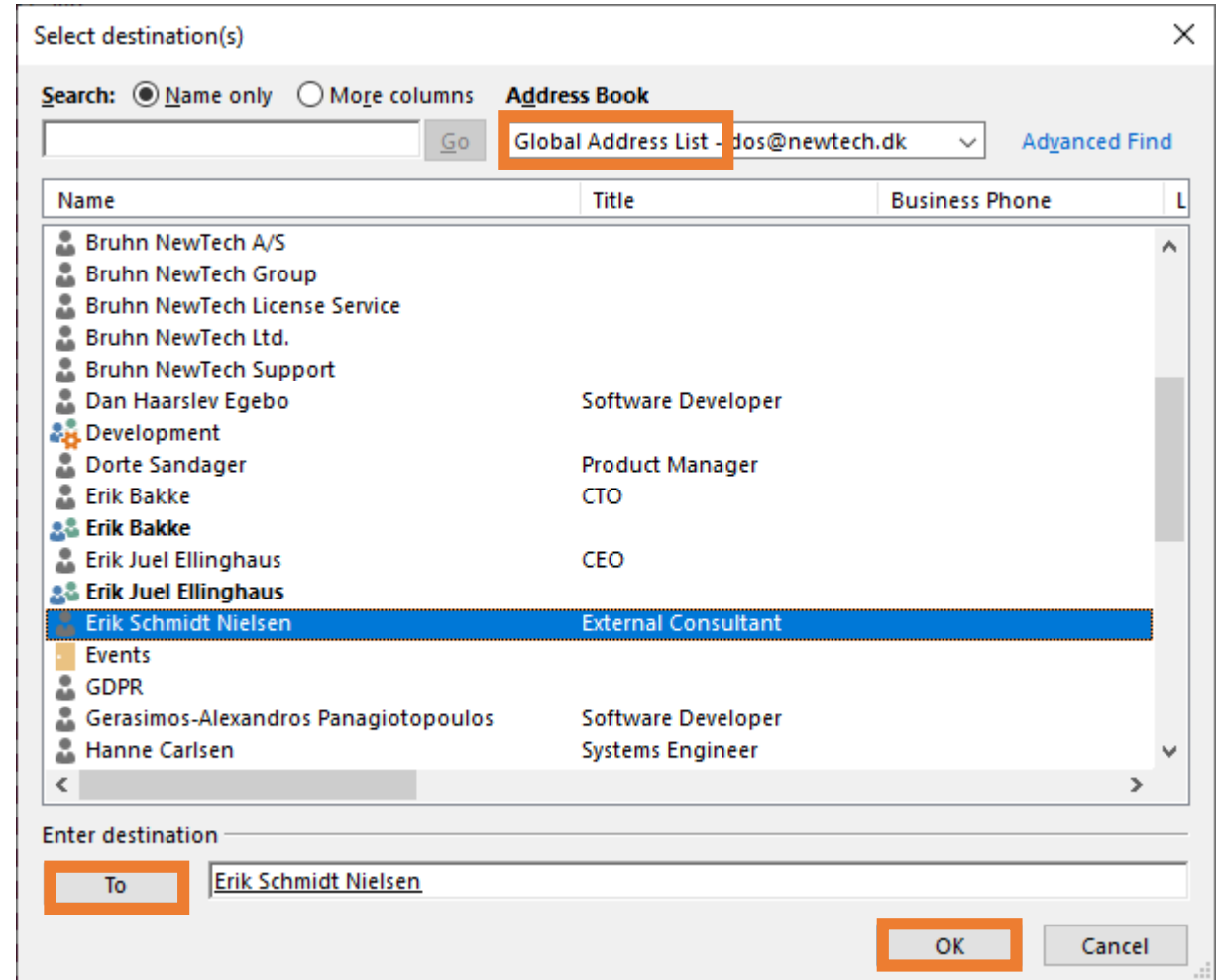

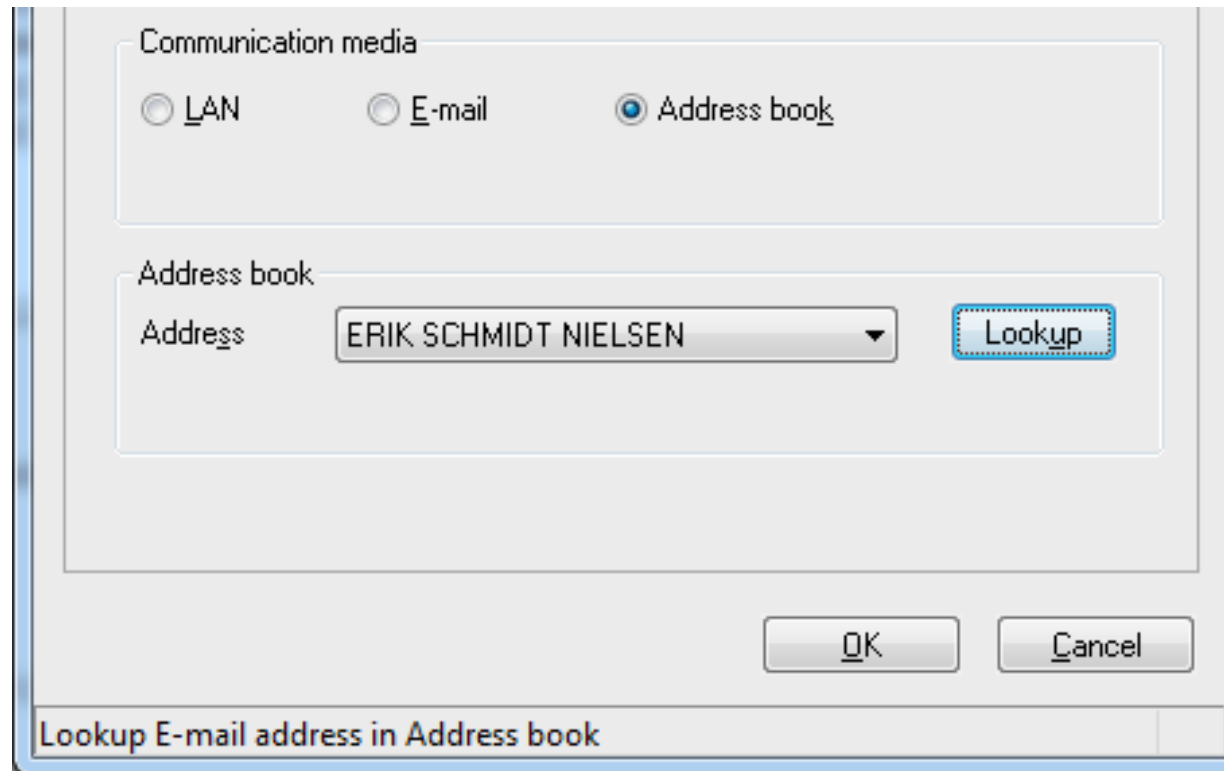

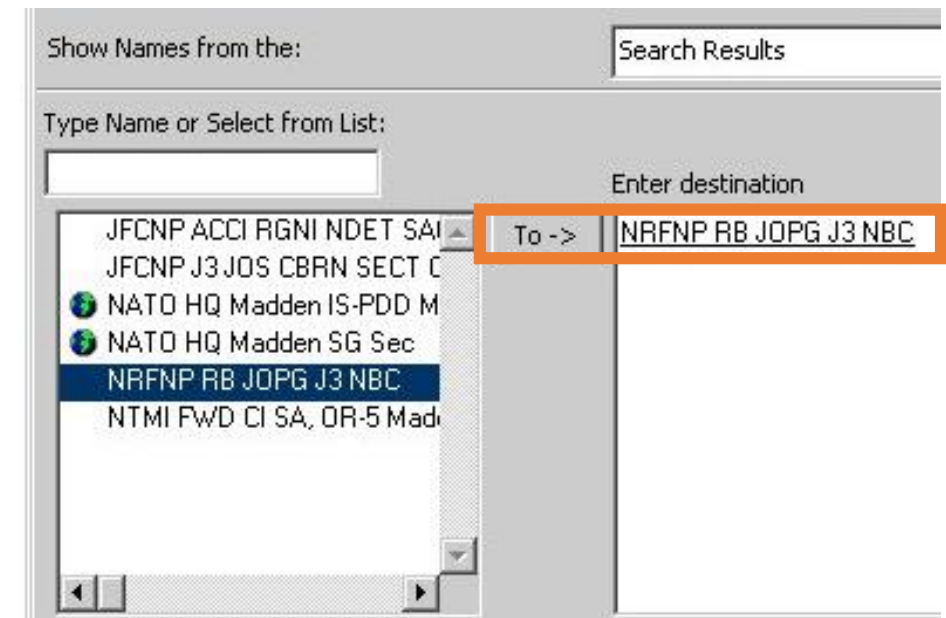


# How to Create Destinations

## Use of Address Book

In some military systems the Address Book is a Global Address List (GAL), which can be used for search before entering the destination mail

The layout may be different from this example based on the operating system



# How to Create Destinations

## Use of Hotspots

If no other network or Wi-Fi is available, you can use Smartphone which can establish a Hotspot

Select: Tools

Select: Network and Wi-Fi

Select:  Hotspot or Internet sharing




Make your computer use Wi-Fi and select the Smartphone Hotspot with the given code for access

# How to Create Destinations

## Destination Formats

Default format used for messages transmission

- CBRN Reports  
(NATO agreed format)
- Info Reports
- Risk Objects
- Units  
(CBRN-Analysis only)

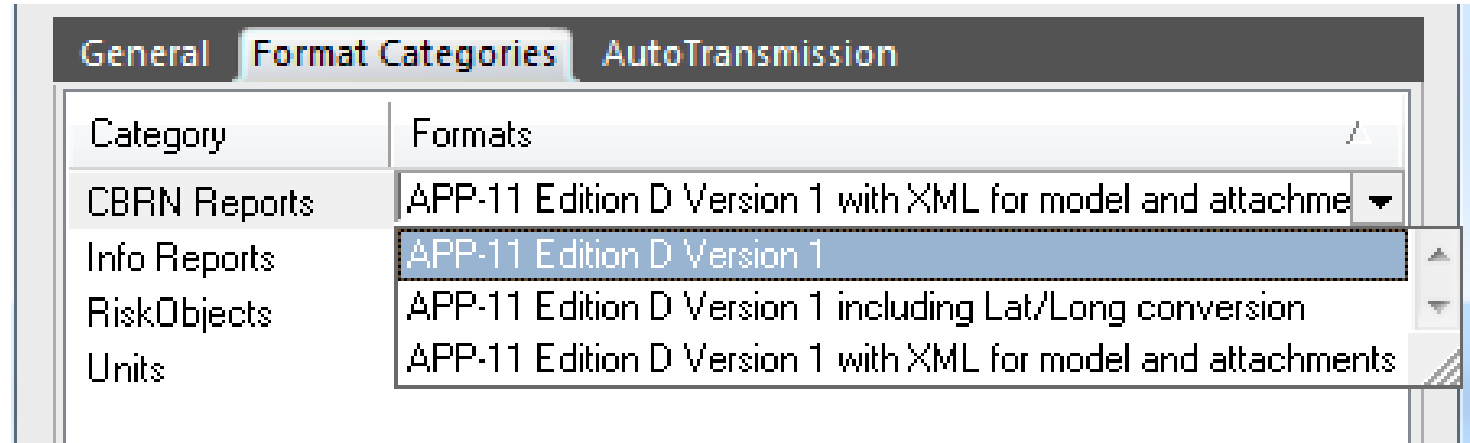

# How to Create Destinations

## Destination Formats



- APP-11 Edition D Version 1.

For pure standard formatted system e.g. CCIS systems

- APP-11 Edition D Version 1 with XML for model and attachments

To be able to transmit none standard information e.g. model plot and attachments

- APP-11 Edition D Version 1 including Lat/Long conversion.

Only for system requiring specific Lat/Long formats (CAN only)
